

Bathrooms With a View: Sunset Point Rest Area has reopened; ADOT project renovated restrooms, ramadas, sidewalks, lighting and more. July 17, 2023

PHOENIX – Great news for Interstate 17 travelers: The Sunset Point Rest Area is open after an Arizona Department of Transportation project to upgrade its restrooms, water and septic systems, and other amenities. To enhance capacity and accessibility, the \$7.5 million project included renovating and reopening the original restroom building that had been closed since the new restroom building opened in 2010.

Along with returning to that sweeping view west toward the Bradshaw Mountains, visitors will notice upgrades to the signage, sidewalks, lighting and landscaping, along with renovated ramadas. Restrooms have new or upgraded lighting fixtures, doors, sinks, hand dryers and more. The project also renovated the rest area's sundial memorial, which honors ADOT employees who have died while serving the state of Arizona. Sunset Point Rest Area serves more than a million visitors a year. For the few who have yet to visit it, Sunset Point is located along I -17 between Black Canyon City and Cordes Junction.



er name is LC-2. We found her in the Albany, New York area. Originally she hailed from Nebraska. I don't have a build sheet for her yet so I may have more to add as to where she was originally purchased later.

LC-2 has some racing history in her fairly recent past as she has raced in two different Hemmings Great Races in the eastern U.S. Garaged in the winters in both Nebraska and New York has helped to keep her total miles down well below 100k miles!

We look forward to seeing you all at the Christmas party. We will keep a log of our adventures to share with you in future stories. DON'T BE STUCK, DRIVE THE NEWEST POST-WAR TRUCK

World War II was a difficult time for all automobile manufacturers, having to cease production of automobiles to aid the federal government in manufacturing war-making equipment. On the other hand it didn't take long for the car companies to realize war contracts were quite lucrative. Studebaker's efforts were rewarded nicely both financially, and as stated in a previous article, winning the "E" award for their impressive efforts in supporting the government.

1941 began as a banner year for Studebaker with the popular Champion and the introduction of the M-Series truck which debuted as the Coupe Express in that first year of truck production. Because the US entered the war at the end of 1941, the 1942 is rare due to a shortened model run which ended in February, 1942. Paul Sievers, a former member of the Grand Canyon Chapter who now lives in Libby, Mont., took a 1942 M15 with him form a Phoenix junk-vard where I had found it back in the late 1980s.

But, this article is not about the "M", it is about the glories of the C-cab that replaced the M-Series in 1949. The 1949 Model was quite modern for its time with a trifecta of changes that propelled it ahead of its competitors. It was a

place Studebaker should have kept but with no support from management the truck line languished until the end of production in 1964. Much has been written about this debacle.

Fred Fox recently completed a series of feature articles in *Turning Wheels* about the 1949 truck, so you might find this somewhat repetitive. However, I have planned this short synopsis for quite sometime; it gives me a chance to showcase a banner in my collection. It was received from Frank Frost who purchased it from an antique dealer in Zumbrota, Minn.

The first of the three changes was the moving of the running boards inside the cab so that the exterior of the truck appeared more streamlined. Most manufacturers did not make this change until the mid '50s. The second change that was of major importance was the double-wall box that hid damage to the inner box wall caused by shifting cargo that could mar the exterior of a truck body using single wall construction. Many trucks did not receive this change until the '60s. It should also be noted that a metal floor was standard with the new box. GM continued to use wood floors well into the '60s. The third and final point was the introduction of the "World's Finest Ventilating and Heating System".

Why was this system so special? It incorporated an airflow system from a grill opening into the fender two-sided apron, creating a plenum that carried air to the vent openings in the firewall, and in those trucks with heaters, to an opening in the driver's side apron that took air to the heater core for warming. Other than the heater box, the system was not visible and did not detract from the new design of the '49 truck.



Other manufacturers used a variety of methods to get fresh air into the cab. Included were: a cowl vent at the bottom of the windshield, a windshield that opened, vent openings on the cab side, just in front of the cab doors, or large tubes installed in the engine bay to carry air from the grill area to the firewall. These tubes occupied a great deal of space and cluttered the compartment.

The '49 opened a long run of C-cab trucks that, in my opinion was the high-water-mark for Studebaker truck manufacturing. The other trucks were all great haulers but the styling tended to follow the Studebaker cars of the day.

"First by Far with a Post-war Car" does not tell the whole story. Admittedly, the '49 truck came out later than the new Studebaker cars, but the new trucks were just as advanced and should have been equally recognized in Studebaker advertising.
