

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

SOMETHING THAT WE TAKE FOR GRANTED: FIRE EXTINGUISHER

(Taken from Odds 'N' Ends by Pete Yuen)

As all Studebaker owners know, we are supposed to have a fire extinguisher by our left front tire whenever we display our cars at an event. Most of them are the dry chemical type. Nothing wrong with that, however, the question is, "Will it function as it should when required?" There are 3 answers to that question and any one of them could be correct.



- 1. Yes. This is good and the way it should be.
- 2. Perhaps -The fire extinguisher has partial effectiveness.
- 3. NO The unit, when needed and used only puts out a small amount of the dry chemical followed only by the propellant. Not good and not effective.

Over time, the dry chemical in the fire extinguisher gets packed and becomes a solid mass. This is due to the vibration as the car is driven. When the fire extinguisher is needed and used, the propellant can only force out a small amount of the chemical and the solid mass remains in the unit where it does absolutely no good towards putting out a fire.

Since we know that the dry chemical has become a solid mass, we also know that it needs to flow freely so the propellant can effectively force it out on to the fire.

If you have a plastic hammer, use it to strike all around and the bottom and side of the fire extinguisher to loosen the mass. An ordinary hammer could be used also, but only strike the fire extinguisher with limited force so as not to dent it. After you feel that the powder has been loosened, shake the fire extinguisher vigorously.

If you have a fire extinguisher that is the CO2 type, nothing needs to be done to maintain its effectiveness.

BEWARE OF SCAMMERS

Beware of scammers impersonating club officers and asking you to pay a bill for some other officer claiming that you will get reimbursed by them.

Chapter members and Yuma residents **Tim and Joen Painter** entered their beautiful 1953 Commander Starlight custom in the annual Midnight at the Oasis Car Show held in Yuma March 1-3. Their '53 was among four Studebakers out of 900+ cars displayed and it received an award, the second in six years it's been entered. Congratulations!



Tim also sent a photo of a wench found by his brother in the desert about 85 miles NE of Yuma. He wrote, "it appears to be an 1880s wrench for Studebaker wagon/buggy wheels". Note STUDEBAKER is embossed on the tool.

A nother example of an artifact from the wagon/buggy era is a folding ruler **Chuck Collins** has in his Studebaker memorabilia collection. The etching on the ruler reads "Studebaker Carriages Buggies and Wagons Lead The World". The reverse side is ruled for twelve inches.





The automobile in the photo on the left was developed by **Porsche** for Studebaker in the early 1950s. In a story on the **Hagerty** site, the history of the potential collaboration between Studebaker and Porsche is covered in an a lengthy article detailing Porsche's desire to enter the U.S. market with a four door sedan. The article begins "It's fairly well known among aficionados of automotive trivia that Studebaker was the official American distributor for Mercedes-Benz cars in the 1950s. Less well known is the fact that the independent automaker based in South Bend, Indiana, had an earlier relationship with another German automaker, Porsche. Ironically, at the same time that the automotive operations of the Stude-

baker Corporation were deteriorating financially, Studebaker's tie-up with Porsche helped it get established as a serious automaker." **Steve Fein** sent a link to the article on the Hagerty site:

SPECULATION

very so often the White Motor Company pops up in my readings. White has a long and colorful history that goes back to 1859. It's amazing how similar this is to the multifaceted Studebaker history that we are all familiar with. And furthermore, that these two companies became intertwined for a short time during the early days of the Depression.

In 1859 Thomas White began making, for sale, a hand operated sewing machine. While living in Massachusetts



in 1876, he decided to move to the midwest with the wave of immigrants relocating there. His family settled in Cleveland, Ohio. By 1890 he was having success at manufacturing bicycles that were so popular at that time. Also, at this time, his sons convinced him to try manufacturing an automobile (does this sound familiar?). By 1899 the company was producing its first steam-powered automobile.

Thomas's sons, Rolin, Windsor, and Walter, decided to take the automobile manufacturing in a different direction, and began to build gas powered cars and trucks in 1910. WWI saw their business expand into the military arena supplying 18,000 vehicles for the war effort, with Russia their main customer. Because White controlled 10% of the U.S. truck market, by the end of the war, it dropped auto production to focus on trucks.

The future of the White Motor Company was going to become a little uncertain even though the company came into the "Roaring 20's" with a roar. By the end of the decade missteps and financial problems began to cloud White's future.

So, why the title "Speculation"? Read on and you will see what a merger with White might have meant to Studebaker. Let's take a look at the next forty years and consider the possibilities. Until his demise in 1933 Albert Erskine, president of Studebaker, was looking for capital to bolster his corporation's financial difficulties. On the other hand White had working capital of a whopping \$22 million, that could benefit Studebaker in a successful merger.

When the time came Mr. Erskine went into the market and purchased 95% of the common stock at \$5 a share. However, there was a small group in White that said no to the merger, wanting more money for the stock. Studebaker was in deep trouble, owing the banks six million dollars. Early in 1933 Mr. Erskine reported a loss for the first time in Studebaker's history.

Let's continue with my speculation. Over at White things were going well. Their prowess in WWII shined well on

the company's future. A glowing star in the war was White's design of the Army's M3 scout car with half-track propulsion. It was apparent that White's future would be in the heavy -duty truck market. Following the war in the early fifties White bought out two competitors, Sterling and Autocar, and in the late fifties purchased Reo and Diamond-T to form a new subsidiary called Diamond-Reo.


In the sixties the company began to flounder and brought in "Bunkie" Knutson from GM/Ford fame to right the ship. With the new management the company returned to profitability for a short time.

The seventies saw White turn to diesels to power their trucks. This was the trend throughout the industry. As with their competitors, White started using Cummins, Cat and Detroit Diesel engines.

After failing to find a partner to merge with, White declared bankruptcy in 1980 and sold their manufacturing plants to Volvo. The White nameplate finally disappeared into the history books in 1995.

So what is there to speculate about? Well, what if there was a successful merger with White Motor Company in the early thirties and that they had stayed together until the end of White's very successful run? We Studebaker nuts may have had our Studebakers manufactured another 17 years, and who's to say what great things may have been brought to our Studebaker trucks, like the Cummins diesel. Let's just sit back and speculate about what might have been and enjoy what we already have.

Foot Note: A merger appeared to happen according to some other sources. I chose my reference because it was the
