In mid-June, I proudly pulled up to Deer Valley Airport for a very special Grand Canyon State Studebaker Drivers Club (SDC) event. It wasn't my first SDC outing—that had taken place three months earlier in March, when, thanks to a kind invitation from Peggy Eastburn, my partner Deena and I traveled to Tucson for the 50th anniversary celebration of the Southern Arizona Chapter at the Tucson Auto Museum. What a blast! The warm welcome we received as newcomers and the sheer fun of the event left a lasting impression. Since then, we've made it a point to attend every SDC gathering we could—from Bosa Donuts and Wally Burger in Peoria to the potluck shindig at the Eastburn's home, where we met new people and reconnected with some familiar faces.


