MEMBER OF THE YEAR BY DEANNA MANLEY

On December 3, at the Chapter Holiday Party we announced the recipient of our Member of the Year for 2005. That honor goes to Dick and Mary Beth Eichof. In November when Dick displayed his other hobby at the meeting we learned that he was raised on a farm in Ohio and so he also collects small farm toys. That farm in Ohio is where he drove his first Studebaker.

Dick's Dad bought a 1941 M5 truck used, from a man who had acquired it from a military surplus yard. Dick spent many years driving the truck for farm work and in town to High School where he met Mary Beth. They dated in that truck in 1952 and 53 then after graduation Dick went into the service and Mary Beth to college. During the ensuing years Dick was without a Studebaker. He served in the Marines working on helicopters and when he got out in 1957 he pursued an education in Aviation. Mary Beth completed her teaching degree and in 1960 they were married. Dick and Mary Beth raised two daughters and still did not have a Studebaker.

Dick worked in aviation until 1980 when he re-located to Arizona and began working for the FAA a position he retired from. STUDEBAKER NATIONAL MUSEUM DEDICATION BY RICHARD DORMOIS

You may have seen pictures of the new Studebaker National Museum in publications to which you subscribe, but, believe me, no photograph can do justice to this fifty five thousand square foot, red brick, three story structure. You really have to be there to appreciate it. The new museum on Chapin Street is in the heart of the older part of south Bend among several century old, flagstone, multi story mansions. The Oliver Mansion and Clement Studebaker's home, Tippecanoe Place are near.

To showcase the opening of this marvelous spectacle, Director Becky Bonham, the museum staff and the City of South Bend presented a series of fund raising gatherings that attracted folks from across the globe. Friday, October 28, 2005, was the two hundred dollar a plate, black tie gala, attended by four hundred and seven Studebaker enthusiasts including members Jaynie and Malcolm Stinson, Nancy and Chester Bradfield and Richard Dormois looking pretty spiffy in their formal attire.

We were met at the entry by valet parkers, doormen and a full brass band to herald our arrival. The South Bend Civic Theater presented a four act historical perspective with the five Studebaker Brothers telling of their part in history of the Studebaker Company. An act was presented between each of the five courses of the meal. Much socializing before and after the meal with few opening remarks, but no speeches. That was tough on the many politicians attending. The meal was prepared and served by the downtown South Bend, La Salle Grill staff who did a superb job. The Grand Canyon State Chapter 1964 Lark billboard attracted much attention.

Seating was pre-arranged and I had the privilege of being seated with Phoebe Miles from the US Embassy in Buenos Aires, Dr. George Rohrbach, Pennsylvania, SDC President Ed Reynolds from Indiana, Turning Wheels Publishers Mr. & Mrs. Chester Bradfield, of Virginia and Mr. and Mrs. Gene Searcy of Saskatchewan. Not name dropping, just pointing out that it was an international affair. Proceeds from the event went to the museum endowment fund.

Saturday evening, a less formal, less expensive party was held for those who wished to be in on the opening festivities. Many were there from the night before, but dressed down a bit. Jacket and tie was acceptable and there were about the same number in attendance. A few speeches at this gathering including Ed Reynolds representing the Studebaker Drivers Club and the fare was from a variety of tastefully done food stations staffed by University of Notre Dame students. A good rock 'n roll band played for listening and dancing. Quite informal and the Saturday night attendees got to see twenty more Studebakers as the previous night's formal dining area was cleared and a fleet ferried over from the old museum and hoisted to the third level in record time. Bill and Mary Cervini and David and Virginia Miller of the Grand Canyon State Chapter enjoyed the weekend activities.

Sunday was the BIG affair. Both the Northern Indiana Historical Museum and the Studebaker National Museum were open to the public free for the ribbon cutting and it was well advertised. Conservative estimates placed the attendance at twelve hundred. The Michiana Men's Chorus sang several numbers as guests listened and danced to their a cappella renditions. Several short speeches by politicians and Ed Reynolds, but the day was about Studebakers. Two hours after the ribbon cutting, hundreds were still coming up the driveway four abreast from parking places blocks away. They were there to see the Studebaker collection from Michigan, Illinois, Indiana and points beyond.

Museum Director, Becky Bonham, her paid staff of seven and many volunteers deserve a great deal of credit for this very special week. Look for nice stories and pictures in the January 2006 issue of Turning Wheels magazine.

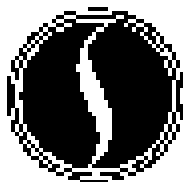

TECH TIP

GEORGE MARTENS

MEMBER IOWA HAWKEYE CHAPTER

Found this in the Big Sky Bulletin, Bernie Harris, editor from Ray Fichthorne, N.Carolina Chapter, SDC.

This is for Steering Repair/Improvement. For an up-grade in center pins, use the bearing style from the pre'62 Studes. Further, instead of just two bearings, add another!

The bearing numbers are Torrington B-1612 and B-1612OH found locally. The B-1612OH (OH stands for oil hole) can be installed in the center of the bell crank and when properly positioned, lining the hole up with the grease fitting will allow the grease to be put in, a bit slower. Adding the third bearing stabilizes the center pin a bit more and when using a used pin with a bit of wear, makes the worn pin reusable. 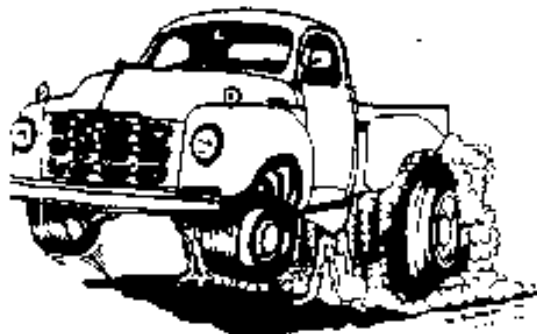
